


MSC015SMA070B4 Silicon Carbide N-Channel Power MOSFET

1 Product Overview

The silicon carbide (SiC) power MOSFET product line from Microsemi increases the performance over silicon MOSFET and silicon IGBT solutions while lowering the total cost of ownership for high-voltage applications. The MSC015SMA070B4 device is a 700 V, 15 m Ω SiC MOSFET in a TO-247 4-lead package with a source sense.



1.1 Features

The following are key features of the MSC015SMA070B4 device:

- Low capacitances and low gate charge
- Fast switching speed due to low internal gate resistance (ESR)
- Stable operation at high junction temperature, T_{J(max)} = 175 °C
- Fast and reliable body diode
- Superior avalanche ruggedness
- RoHS compliant

1.2 Benefits

The following are benefits of the MSC015SMA070B4 device:

- High efficiency to enable lighter, more compact system
- Simple to drive and easy to parallel
- Improved thermal capabilities and lower switching losses
- Eliminates the need for external freewheeling diode
- Lower system cost of ownership

Figure 1 • Drain Current vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage




Figure 2 • Drain Current vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage






Figure 3 • Drain Current vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage




Figure 5 • RDS(on) vs. Junction Temperature




Figure 7 • Capacitance vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage




Figure 4 • Drain Current vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage




Figure 6 • Gate Charge Characteristics




Figure 8 ● IDM vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage






Figure 9 ● IDM vs. VDS Third Quadrant Conduction




Figure 11 • VGS(th) vs. Junction Temp.




Figure 10 • IDM vs. VDS Third Quadrant Conduction




Figure 12 • Forward Safe Operating Area





Figure 13 • Maximum Transient Thermal Impedance






